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2024, THE REVELATION OF A YEAR

The Mailly-Champagne vineyards are back to normal, after 10 days of harvesting for Mailly Grand Cru.

The grapes are of excellent quality, with good degrees of ripeness. Quantities are low, as we expected, but this harvest augurs well for a highly promising 2024 vintage.





It's been a trying wine-growing year, with constant hard work and high standards since flowering in order to protect the vines from the particularly excessive rain this year.

We are immensely proud of our winegrowers, who have shown remarkable resilience throughout the year. Their commitment right up to the last day of the harvest meant that the grapes were harvested at their ideal ripeness.

Founded in 1929 by 24 winegrowers, they all had the same particularity: to have vines only on the Grand Cru that is Mailly-Champagne, in the north of the Montagne de Reims.
